What does it mean to be involved in 4-H?

Your child comes home excited that they have joined 4-H at their school. What is 4-H? What does that mean to you as a parent?

4-H is the youth development program offered by UT Extension. This outreach program of the University of Tennessee targets youth in grades 4—12 and provides activities and events that help young people learn valuable life skills.

Students participate in 4-H activities at their school as an educational program. 4-H Agents work hard to ensure that activities conducted relate to lessons and standards being addressed by the teachers in Putnam County. 4-H is meant to enhance your child's learning environment.

There is no cost to be a 4-H member and all activities conducted at



school are free. Some special events such as animal shows and summer camp have costs associated with them, but are reasonable when compared to other youth programs.

Other lessons presented to your 4-H'er will relate to science.



Other Activities for your 4th Grade 4-H Member

Outside of the classroom there are numerous other activities for your 4-H member to be involved in.

We offer 4-H members opportunities to show their horses, cattle, sheep, swine, and goats through various animal shows each spring and summer.

The 4-H Chick-Chain project is a favorite in our county. 4-H members sign up to receive baby chicks, raise them, and return 3 to a show and auction. Sign-ups are held in February of each year. Junior 4-H Camp is a week long camp during the summer. This camp is open to youth in grades 4—6 and features traditional camp activities such as swimming, canoeing, fishing, crafts, campfires and more. Sign-up is in May and there is a cost to attend the camp.

Archery is one of our newest activities. We offer training in basic compound bow usage and members are allowed to bring their own bows for competition. There is a fee for Archery to cover costs of entry fees for competition and maintenance of bows and equipment.



Judging teams are a popular option for many youth. Members attend specialized classes for 3-4 weeks and attend a contest to test their knowledge. We offer the following judging teams to 4th grade members: Horse, Livestock, Wildlife, and Forestry. There are no fees for the judging team classes, but there is an entry fee for horse judging.

4-H members are also encouraged to create items to enter in the Putnam County Fair held each year in August. 4th grade members are eligible to enter in the 4-H section and earn premium money.

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
